

CORE LEVEL CARD ONE

ROLE PLAYS:

A. You converse with a Cuban student while on a school trip to Havana, Cuba. He/she wants to know about your school. The Examiner will play the role of the Cuban student.

1. Candidate: Say that it is big and old.
2. Candidate: Say that there are five hundred students.
3. Candidate: Say that they do not study much.
4. Candidate: Say that basketball is a popular sport.
5. Candidate: Say that you like Spanish.

B. You are on holiday with your family in Chile. You go into a clothing shop to buy a new jacket. The Examiner will play the role of the sales assistant.

1. Candidate: Greet the sales assistant and say you are looking for a jacket.
2. Candidate: Ask if you can try on a size 40.
3. Candidate: Say you think it is too small.
4. Candidate: Say that you will take a black jacket.
5. Candidate: Respond appropriately.

CORE LEVEL CARD TWO

ROLE PLAYS:

A. You are in Mexico. You need to go to the airport and call a taxi. The Examiner will play the role of the cab driver.

1. Candidate: Say you are going to the airport.
2. Candidate: Say you have one suitcase.
3. Candidate: Say it is at 3 o'clock.
4. Candidate: Say that you do not have much time.
5. Candidate: Ask if the airport is far.

B. You are working at the reception desk of a hotel in The Bahamas. A Mexican tourist who has just returned from the beach approaches the desk. The Examiner will play the role of the tourist.

1. Candidate: Greet the guest and ask if (s)he likes the water.
2. Candidate: Say the weather is good today.
3. Candidate: Tell the guest that his /her son called.
4. Candidate: Say that the son must speak to him/her immediately.
5. Candidate: Respond appropriately.

CORE LEVEL CARD THREE

ROLE PLAYS:

B. You are being interviewed for a job that requires you to speak Spanish. The Examiner will play the role of the interviewer.

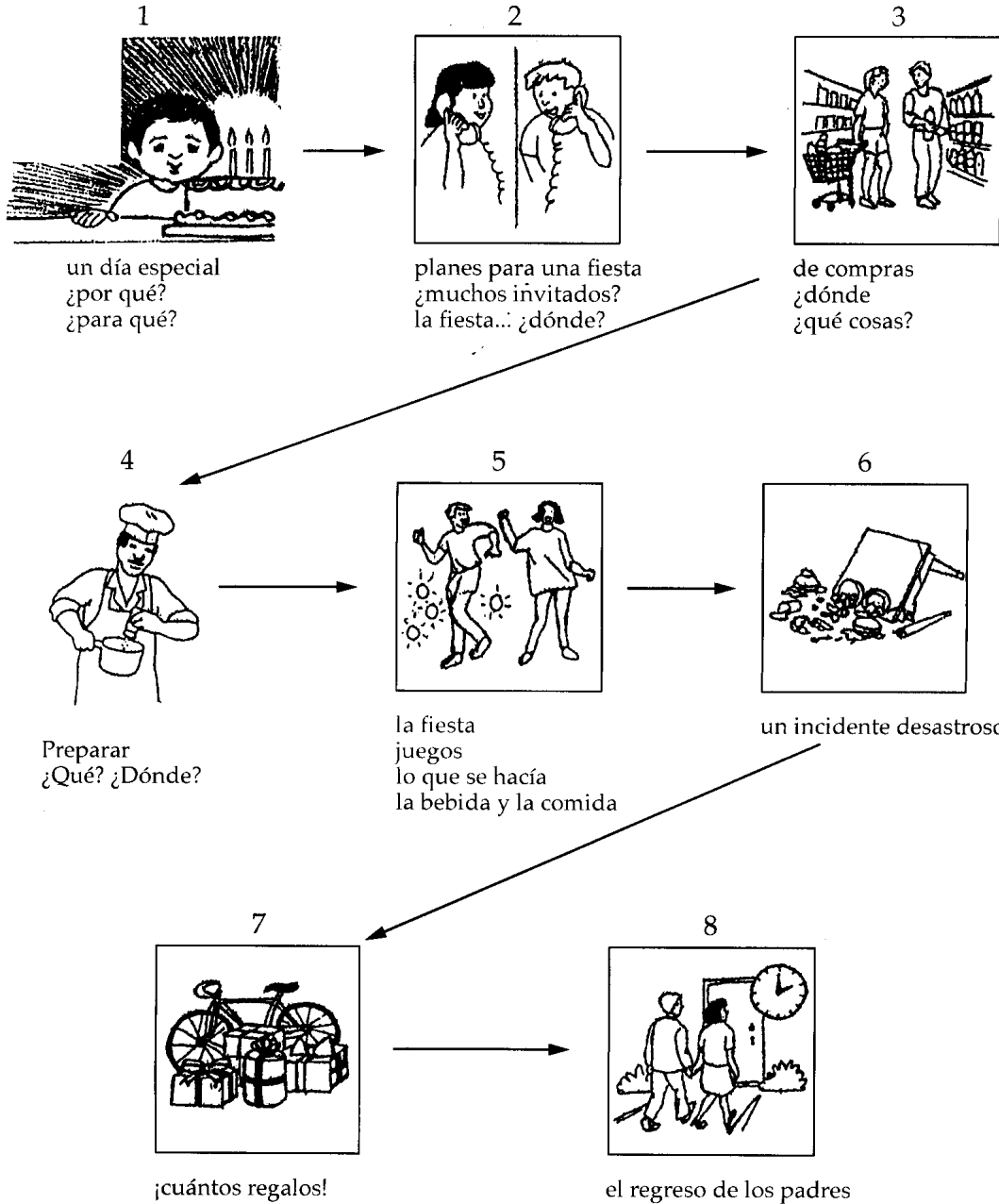
1. Candidate: Say that you need some money.

 5. Candidate: Say that you can start in two weeks.

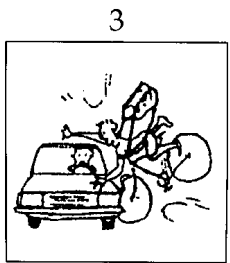
